### The College Fund

The College Fund is vital to the functioning of IBI as it enables us to subsidise student fees to ensure that our courses are affordable enabling IBI to continue its mission.

Each year, the Irish government supports Third-Level education by almost one billion Euro. However, neither IBI nor our students receive government funding. In fact, students who come to IBI are not eligible for student grants, student loans, or the back to education schemes.

Raising fees is challenging for many of our students. Student fees contribute approximately 40% of our annual income and the remaining 60% comes through gifts. In the absence of funding or grants, we seek to keep our fees low enough to make IBI courses accessible to anyone who wants to come. As a result, by God's grace we fundraise around €300,000 each year to keep the Institute running and courses accessible. IBI's funding comes mainly from individuals, churches and trusts, with 70% coming from the island of Ireland.


